writings not considered inspired (many types)

Apocrypha – Intertestamental writings NT era Non-Canonical

- Gnostics writings
- Apocryphal writings

Apocrypha

 "apocrypha" means "things put away" or "things hidden", From Greek adjective ἀπόκρυφος (apokryphos), "obscure" writings considered useful but not divinely inspired.

Inerrancy

"The inerrancy of the Bible means simply that the <u>Bible tells the truth</u>. Truth can and does include approximations, free quotations, language of appearances, and different accounts of the same event as long as those do not contradict." – Charles Ryrie (1981)

Luke

Classic genealogy starting with Adam to Joseph (but not really the son of Joseph)

- Punishment for killing.

Atheist & naturalist critique


- Miracles cannot happen because they would violate the laws of nature.

Jeremiah 25 (70yrs Captivity)

Jeremiah 25:11-12 (NIV) This whole country will become a desolate wasteland, and these nations <u>will serve the</u> <u>king of Babylon seventy years</u>. "But when the seventy years are fulfilled, I will punish the king of Babylon and his nation, the land of the Babylonians.
